WHAT TO DO WITH MONEY

I. PAY YOUR BILLS

- a. Luke 10:7. The Labourer is worthy of his hire.
 - i. His labour is worth what you both agree it is worth.
- b. Leviticus 19:13. Don't withhold a labourer's wages. If somebody works for you, pay them.
- c. James 5:4. The people you cheat will cry out unto the Lord.
- d. Jeremiah 22:13-14. Don't build a house you can't afford to pay for. (Luke 14:28).
- e. Malachi 3:5. Those who don't pay their bills are included in the list with sorcerers and adulterers. They don't fear God.
- f. Proverbs 11:1. God hates a false balance/ dishonest business transactions.
 - i. Stealing is as great a sin as the other things that God calls an "abomination."
- g. Proverbs 22:1, Ecclesiastes 7:1. A good name is of great value.
 - i. We need to guard our reputation by dealing honestly and fairly with all people.
 - ii. How many people will go to hell because they don't want to hear the gospel from somebody named "Cheat" or "Thief" or "Unfair" or "Liar." What's your name?
- h. Luke 16:9-11. You've got to be faithful in your business dealings in this world if you expect God to trust you with the unsearchable riches of Christ.
- i. Matthew 20:1-15. If you are a business owner, you have the right to decide who to hire and how much salary to pay.
 - i. Employees should be content if they receive their agreed salary. They should not concern themselves with other peoples' salaries.
- j. Luke 19:12-25. If you are a business owner, you have the right to reward the hardest workers and get rid of the unproductive workers.
 - i. Employees should perform their job as instructed or expect to be fired.
