"Therefore we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip." (Heb 2:1)

Things alter for the worse spontaneously if they do not alter for the better designedly.

This lesson will stress the importance of maintaining your Christian walk and not letting spiritual things slip.

CAUSES FOR SPIRITUAL NEGLECT:

1. A SHALLOW WORK AT THE BEGINNING

- Feelings were stirred, but the conscience never awakened to convict a person of sin.
- This is the shallow ground that Jesus spoke of (Mark 4:5-6).
- There was no godly sorrow to work repentance (2 Cor. 7:10).

2. LACK OF CHASTENING

• God's children are chastened (Heb 12:6). Without chastening, you will let the truth slip away.

3. PROSPERITY IN THIS WORLD

- Those who have everything they want often see no need for God.
- Psalm 73:12, Proverbs 1:32, Job 22:17, James 2:5

4. INATTENTION TO GOD'S WARNINGS

- Ignoring preaching, gospel tracts, etc. They'll have no excuse on reckoning day.
- Proverbs 29:1, 1 Kings 13:20-24.

5. BLINDNESS TO ONE'S TRUE SPRITUAL STATE

- Their religion has convinced them that they're "good enough." They believe they are saved.
- Liberals have convinced them that being sincere is all that's important.

6. CONFORMITY TO SURROUNDING INDIFFERENCE

- Peer pressure from ungodly friends often keeps people from Christ. (Eph. 2:2).
- Adapting to surroundings causes people to slip away (Lot in Sodom).
- Society allows a little bit of sinful activity (in the theaters, on the TV, in the schools, etc.) and people get used to it over time.
 - When people do what society approves of, they no longer see themselves as sinners.
 - o It isn't hard to let righteousness slip in today's corrupt society.

7. KEEPING HOLD OF SOME DARLING SIN

- Unwilling to give up a sinful relationship.
- Loving a vice more than the Savior (drinking, drugs, sins of the flesh, illegal or immoral job etc.).
- People would rather keep the pet sin that is destroying their life than to come to Jesus.

HEBREWS CHAPTER 2 Continued:

- **Vs 5** Angels will not be in charge of the "world to come."
 - Jesus Christ will be the One ruling in the future day. Angels will be subject to Him, as will
 everything else.
 - We will be "equal unto the angels" (Luke 20:34-36) in that day, and also in subjection to Jesus Christ.
 - Note: this passage in Luke refutes the Mormon teaching that men will attain godhood. We will be no higher than an angel. Angels have not attained deity.
- **Vs 6** "But <u>one</u> in a certain place testified..." the prophets are not identified in the book of Hebrews. Rather, the writer of Hebrews emphasizes that God is the author of those quotations from the prophets. God spake (Heb 1:1) by the prophets.
 - Verse 6 is a quote from Psalm 8:4-6.

"What is man, that thou art mindful of him?" The writer is amazed that God would even set his thoughts on man.

"Or the son of man, that thou visitest him?" God walked among men for 33 ½ years (1 Tim 3:16).

Job 7:17, "What is man, that thou shouldest <u>magnify</u> him?" God chose to make mankind more important than any of His other creations (animals, angels, Lucifer, etc.), not because we deserve it, but because of His great love (Rom. 5:8).

- 7-8 God made man "a little lower than the angels."
 - This verse is often misread as being a reference to Jesus Christ. But man is still the subject here.

God crowned man "with glory and honour." This is a reference to Adam before the fall when God "didst set him over the works of thy hands." Man was in charge from the day of his creation.

God "put all things in subjection under his (man's) feet." Most bible cross-references incorrectly direct you to Jesus Christ.

Christ will restore what the first Adam lost, but this verse is a reference to man in his innocence.

"But now we see not yet all things put under him." God became a man so He could recover what Adam lost. As a man, Christ could restore the fallen race.

"Not yet." The importance of rightly dividing:

- Matthew 28:18 Jesus has all power in heaven and in earth.
- **Revelation 11:15-17** In the middle of the Tribulation period, the kingdoms of this world become the Lord's.
 - This is proof that Hebrews was not written to Hebrews in the Tribulation period. Heb. 2:8 says, "Not yet." In the Tribulation, all things are put under man because Christ has restored the natural order in the earth as they were before the fall.
- Vs 9 Jesus was "made a little lower than the angels" (a body was prepared for Him, Heb. 10:5) "for the suffering of death" (the purpose of His coming) "crowned with glory and honour." That is Christ on His throne in heaven today. This is the Christ in view in the book of Hebrews.
