A BRIDE FOR ISAAC

Genesis 24

17 January 2025

Genesis 24 presents a remarkable picture of the Father in heaven sending His servant, the Holy Spirit, to the earth to seek a bride for His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ.

- 1. (vs 1-4) THE SERVANT IS SENT BY THE FATHER TO SEEK A BRIDE FOR THE SON.
- 2. THE BRIDE WILL NOT BE A CANAANITE (unregenerate people, no new birth) (vs 3).
 - a. They will be kin to the Father of the Bridegroom (through the new birth) (vs 4).
- 3. **(vs 5-8)** THE SON WILL NOT GO BACK TO THE COUNTRY WHERE HE WAS BEFORE TO SEEK A BRIDE FOR HIMSELF.
 - a. He will stay at his father's house and the father will send the servant for the bride.
 - b. The bride will have to respond to the drawing and the pleading of the servant.
- 4. THE SERVANT WILL TELL THE BRIDE ABOUT THE FATHER AND THE SON.
 - a. He will not take her by force. She must respond to the appeals of the servant and be willing to come.
- 5. (vs 10) ALL THE MASTER'S GOODS WERE IN THE SERVANT'S HANDS.
 - a. Representative of the "earnest of the Spirit" (2 Cor. 1:22, 5:5).
 - i. This was small part of the wealth of the master. It would assure the bride that there was much more (see 1 Cor. 2:9-10).
- 6. (vs 11-12) THE SERVANT IS NOT LABORING FOR HIS OWN PLEASURE, BUT FOR THE PLEASURE OF HIS MASTER.
 - a. The Holy Spirit is grieved when people glorify him. His purpose is to testify of Jesus Christ (John 15:26, 16:13).
- 7. (vs 13-14) The servant prays that the right bride will come and meet a certain set of criteria.
 - a. She is like the good ground that received the good seed, the word of God (Lk 8:5-15).
 - b. Notice that the humility of the woman would play a part in her being able to receive the word of the servant.
 - i. The people who will come to God are those who are down low (James 4:10).
- 8. (vs 22-26) REBEKAH RECEIVED THE SERVANT INTO HER HOME AFTER BELIEVING HIS WORDS ABOUT THE SON AND THE FATHER.
 - a. Having believed, she received a few tokens from the servant (earnest).
 - b. The New Testament believer has received the earnest of the Spirit:
 - i. A Comforter (Jn 14:16-18)
 - ii. Peace that passes understanding (Jn 14:27, Php 4:7)
 - iii. Eternal security (1 Jn 5:11-12; Jn 5:24)
 - iv. Guidance and direction from the word of God (Ps 119:105)
 - v. A promise from the Son of God that He'll be with us always (Mt. 28:20, Heb 13:5)
- 9. (vs 27-28) WHEN REBEKAH RECEIVED THE WITNESS OF THE SERVANT ABOUT THE FATHER AND THE SON, SHE IMMEDIATELY STARTED TELLING PEOPLE ABOUT IT.
 - a. Compare this to the woman at the well in John 4:29.

- 10. (vs 29-31) REBEKAH'S TESTIMONY LED OTHERS TO BELIEVE AND RECEIVE THE SERVANT.
- 11. (vs 32-33) HEARING FROM THE SERVANT WAS MORE IMPORTANT TO REBEKAH'S FAMILY THAN EATING.
 - a. When you become part of the Bride, material things of this world become less important than the things of God.
- 12. (vs 35-38) NOW THAT REBEKAH HAS RECEIVED THE SERVANT, SHE IS ABLE TO RECEIVE ALL THE DETAILS ABOUT THE FATHER AND THE SON AND THE RICHES.
 - a. The things of the Spirit of God are spiritually discerned (1 Cor 2:14).
- 13. (vs 42-44) THE SERVANT WAS INTERCEDING FOR THE BRIDE BEFORE HE CAME TO HER.
 - a. The Holy Spirit intercedes for you before you're saved, protecting you, creating the right circumstances for you to be receptive to His invitation.
- 14. (vs 48-50) THERE WAS A CALL FOR A DECISION TO GO WITH THE SERVANT.
- 15. (vs 51-53) OTHER PEOPLE IN THE BELIEVER'S LIFE ALSO ENJOY THE BLESSINGS OF GOD.
- 16. (vs 54-55) WHEN THE BELIEVER IS READY TO LEAVE THE OLD LIFE BEHIND AND GO FORWARD WITH THE SERVANT OF THE FATHER, FAMILY AND FRIENDS RESIST.
- 17. (vs 56-58) THE BRIDE IS WILLING TO TAKE THE DIFFICULT JOURNEY WITH THE SERVANT.
- 18. (vs 59) MANY WHO BELIEVE WILL NOT LEAVE THEIR OLD LIFE AND THEIR OLD WAYS.
- 19. (vs 60) THE BELIEVER WILL HAVE ENEMIES, BUT ONE DAY ALL THAT THEY POSSESS WILL BELONG TO THE BRIDE WHEN HER BRIDEGROOM COMES TO TAKE POSSESSION.
- 20. (vs 61) THE BRIDE CONFIDENTLY FOLLOWS THE SERVANT OF THE FATHER. SHE TRUSTS THAT HE KNOWS THE RIGHT WAY.
- 21. (vs 62-64) THE SON LEAVES THE FATHER'S HOME TO MEET THE BRIDE ON HER WAY THERE.
 - a. This is a picture of 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 when Christ meets the bride in the clouds.
- 22. (vs 65) THE BRIDE DID NOT RECOGNIZE THE BRIDEGROOM. SHE LOVED HIM BY FAITH.
 - a. The New Testament believer loves Christ Jesus, though never having seen Him (1 Pet 1:8)
- 23. (vs 65) THE BRIDE VEILED HERSELF WHEN SHE SAW THE SON.
 - a. No matter how good you are, the Son's glory outshines yours. When you see Him, you'll want to cover yourself in shame.
- 24. (vs 66) THE SERVANT REPORTS TO THE SON AND PRESENTS THE BRIDE.
- 25. (vs 67) THE BRIDE IS A COMFORT TO THE SON AFTER HIS MOTHER'S DEATH.
 - a. Israel was the bride of the Father. She was unfaithful (Hosea 1-2) and broke her relationship with God the Father.
 - i. Jesus Christ was rejected by Israel (John 1:11, Luke 19:14, John 19:15).
 - 1. God blinded their eyes and hardened their hearts (John 12:40, Rom 11:25)
- 26. THE SERVANT'S WORK IS FINISHED. HE DISAPPEARS FROM SCRIPTURE.
 - a. Once the bride is delivered to the Son, the Holy Spirit's work is done. He'll not be on earth during the Tribulation.
 - b. "Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor 6:2)
